KAMPALA. After winning cash prizes at the Jaguar Sprints in Bweyogerere last weekend, Tara Kisawuzi and William Sanford are pumped up to get crucial points for their sides as the 5th edition of the Pursuit Swim League season climaxes today.

Kisawuzi clocked a new personal best (PB) 26.38 in the preliminaries of

the 14 and Over girls' 50m freestyle event at Jaguar's event, then won the final in 27.90 in the midst of rain.

Flames, which has 10 points in this November and December circuit of the league, will hope Kisawuzi brings her A game to the British School of Kampala (BSK Muyenga) pool on Friday night to help them secure third place as the top two positions are already between Talons and Jets.

Sanford's Jets have 18 points - just one behind Talons, which had Elijah Wamala and Elisha Rukundo in Bweyogerere.

Sanford won three races. He qualified for the 11-13 boys' 50m fly final in 32.03 then finished 4th with a

31.77 PB. He clocked a 32.28 PB in the 50m back prelims then won the final in 32.90.

He topped 100m IM qualification with a 1:12.64 and won the final in 1:11.35. He was a third qualifier in the 50m breaststroke with a 37.23 but finished 5th with a 40.31 in the finals. He qualified for the 50m free in 27.36 then lowered that to 27.10 to win the final.

Rukundo topped the 8 and Under boys in the 25m butterfly, breaststroke, and freestyle events. But this evening, he will be involved in 50m races across all styles.

Wamala's 29.32 left him ranked 7th in the 14 & Over boys' 50m fly. The

33.17 got him 9th place in the 50m back while the 37.96 got him 16th place in the 50m breaststroke, and the 28.03 ranked 11th in the 50m free. He had a 1:12.96 PB in the 100m individual medley.

In the same age group, Adam Katumba was 9th in the 50m fly (30.95), 7th in 50m back (32.27 PB), 15th in 100m IM (1:14.44) and 50m breaststroke (37.85 PB), and 16th in 50m free (28.72). That performance will give Jets even more confidence as they hope to upset Talons.

Colts' Raymon Ssali, also in the 11-13 age group, was 9th in both the 50m fly and 100m IM with a 35.41 and 1:22.95 respectively.
