Deserted by her mother


On December 29, 2024, a baby boy named Emmanuel Beckham Owamani was abandoned by his mother in Mareju Cell, Nyakabungo Ward, Rubanda Town Council, Rubanda district.

A Good Samaritan, James Byaruhanga, rescued the child and reported the incident to Rubanda Police Station. Initially, the baby was taken to Muko Health Centre IV for basic care and treatment, as he appeared unhealthy.

Later, he was transferred to Kabale Regional Referral Hospital, where he was admitted to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit for 10 days.

On January 9, last year, Owamani was referred to Kisoro Porter's Village Babies Home for care.

On November 4, the senior probation and welfare officer of Rubanda district transferred the child to Nsambya Babies Home in Kampala city for safe custody as efforts continue to find him a foster family.

According to Shamirah Nakazibwe, a resident of Nsangi-Kitemu Zone in Kyengera Town Council, Wakiso district, on November 14 last year, at around 6:00am, she found an abandoned baby girl while on her way to work.

Nakazibwe informed her husband and picked up the child. They stayed with the baby for a few days, hoping that someone would come to claim her, but no one did.

The case was later reported at Nabbingo Police Station and forwarded to Nsangi Police Division under the Child Welfare Office. Through the probation officer of Wakiso district, the child was referred to Chrystal Children's Centre for custodianship.
