

ITC at 10: Sector Leaders Applaud Milestones in Insurance Professionalization

The Insurance Training College (ITC) marked a decade of service with strong praise from Uganda's top insurance and petroleum regulators, who hailed its central role in raising professional standards and strengthening sector capacity.

Insurance Regulatory Authority (IRA) Chief Executive Officer, Alhaj Ibrahim Lubega Kaddunabi, commended ITC for its remarkable growth and its contribution to shaping a more professional and accountable insurance industry.

Speaking at the college's 10th anniversary dinner, Kaddunabbi described ITC as a mature institution that has evolved into a key pillar for sector development.

"We are here to salute the achievements made yesterday

by the Insurance Training College, what we started has now matured to a level where we can be sure that we will continue to grow" he said.

He reflected on the early struggles of establishing vital sector structures—such as the Uganda Insurers Association and the Insurance Appeals Tribunal—noting that their current strength demonstrates how far the industry has progressed. He added that these achievements were a result of persistence, collaboration, and a shared vision for industry excellence.

Kaddunabbi described the establishment of ITC as one of his proudest accomplishments and expressed gratitude for the institution's role in shaping the future of the sector. "Insurance Training College, thank you. We

cannot thank you enough because we know where you are, we know where we are, and we know where we are going," he said.

He also revealed that a major ITC infrastructure project—the development of a new 20-acre campus—had influenced his decision to delay retirement. "I gave an assignment to the ITC to put up a real college—a 20-acre Insurance Training College," he disclosed.

The IRA CEO further applauded the sector's partnerships with government agencies, particularly the Petroleum Authority of Uganda (PAU), which he said had demonstrated strong compliance with insurance requirements in the oil and gas sector. He congratulated graduates and encouraged them to champion the transformation of Uganda's insurance industry.
