Self-drive made Nabulya excel, says father

Speaking after the release of the Primary Leaving Examinations (PLE) results yesterday, Leticia Nabulya Sseruwu's father, Hannington Sseruwu, could not hide his pride as he reflected on her performance. He described it as a reward for years of sacrifice and commitment.

"I am so happy about my daughter's performance. As a parent, when you sacrifice and put in a lot of money to educate your child and then you see the results, it is very fulfilling," he said.
