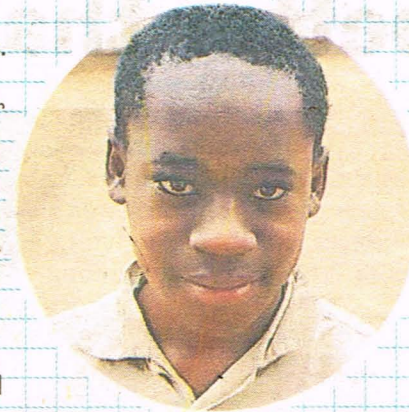


Importance of sports competitions

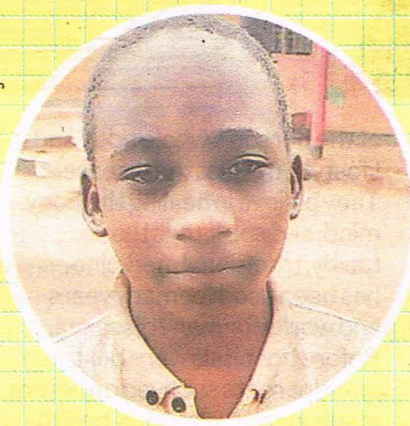


We celebrate the good PLE results

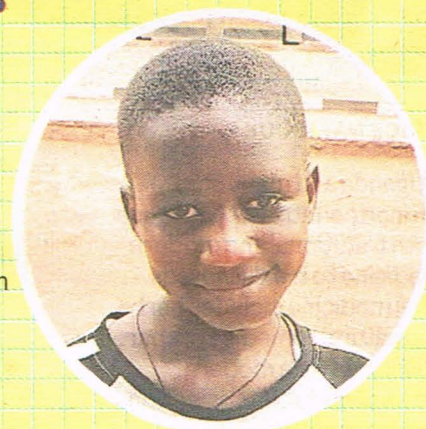


Provide clean water and food in schools
