Similarly, Rebecca Kasemire, who also scored 4As and 5Bs, described her academic

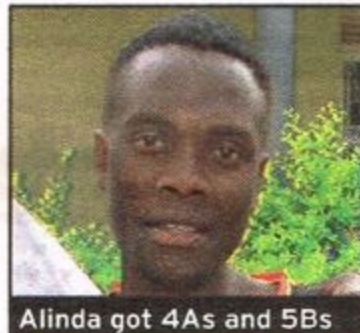
journey as demanding but highly rewarding.
