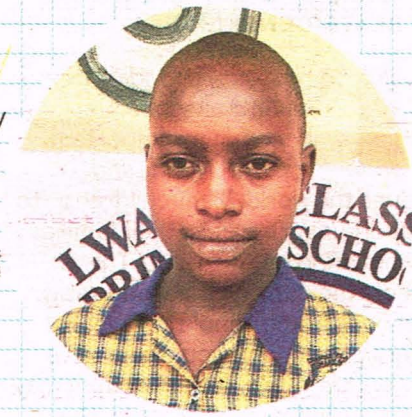


My favourite hobby

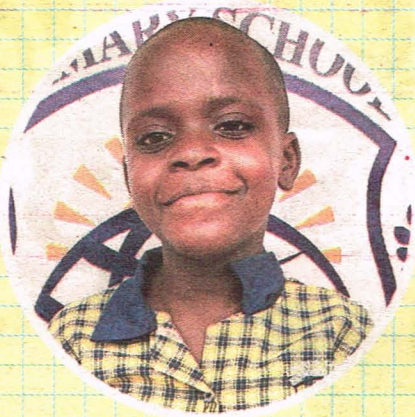


Helping others unites us
