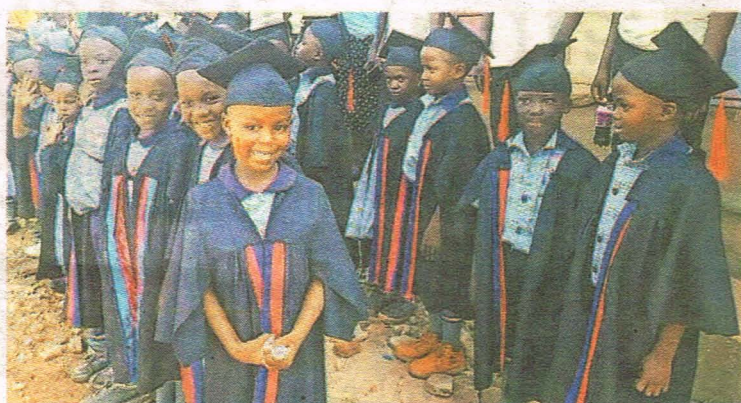




Best pupils Martha Namugalu, Jordan Omondi and Emma Chelangat receive certificates from the school director.
