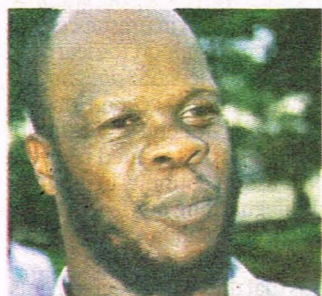


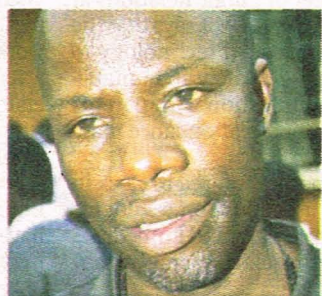

"Digital transformation initiative is a project which is using UICT as a center to help underserved communities to acquire digital skills."

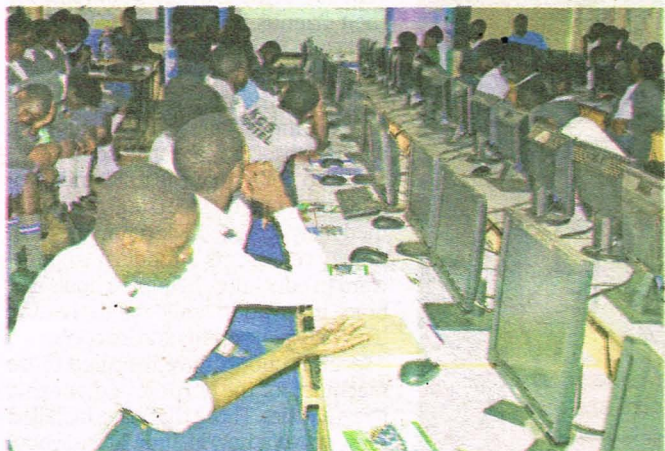

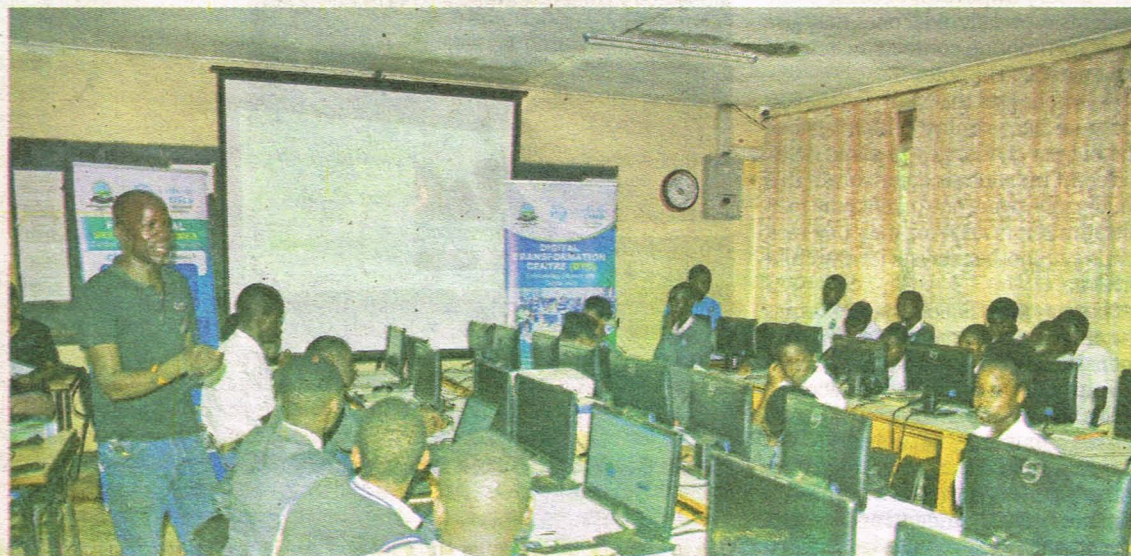
"I started the ICT club in my S.5 last year with 21 members. We engage students in a step by step process of using AI."
