

Bishop urges learners to resist peer pressure

The Bishop of West Ankole Diocese, Johnson Twinomujuni, has cautioned learners against immorality and risky behaviour, arguing that their bodies are the foundation of their future.

Twinomujuni delivered the message, while presiding over a thanksgiving service at Parental Care Nursery and Primary School in Bushenyi district, following the school's outstanding performance in the 2025 Primary

Leaving Examinations (PLE).

He cautioned pupils against alcohol consumption, smoking and irresponsible sexual behaviour, saying such habits can shatter their dreams.

"You need your body because you cannot do anything without your body. When you lose it, you have lost everything," he said.

Quoting John 15:16, the bishop encouraged learners to live purposeful lives.

Bushenyi-Ishaka Municipality education officer, Dan Mugyenyi, attributed the area's good academic performance to efforts by schools and stakeholders.
