Who knows Biyinzika's parents?

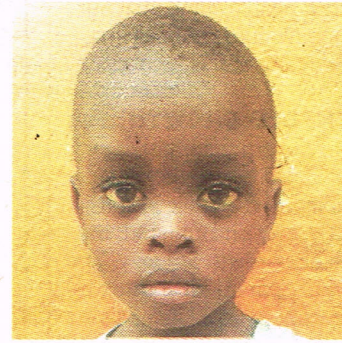
Biyinzika was dumped in Kasenene zone, Wobulenzi Town Council in Luwero district by a person who was identified as Hamza Ssemambo, on November 23, 2022.

The child was rescued by the residents who forwarded the matter to Wobulenzi police station. However, the local

authorities and residents did not know anything about the child's relatives.

Later on, the young boy was transferred to Happy Times Child Care Initiatives, where he was named Joram Biyinzika.

Where is Emmanuel Kuganja's family?

On December 19, 2024, he was abandoned in Wobulenzi village, Wobulenzi town council in Luwero district by unidentified person.

The young boy was rescued by a Good Samaritan who reported the child to Luwero police station in the office of child and family protection unit.

He was named Emmanuel Kuganja, after he was transferred to Happy Times Child Care Initiatives for safety. Kuganja is estimated to be 1-year and two-months-old.

Esau Mubeezi was found in Binyonyi zone

Last year, on April 21, a Good Samaritan, Cissy Gwokyalya picked a baby boy in a bar in Binyonyi zone Luwero town council in Luwero district.

Gwokyalya reported the incident to child welfare office to Luwero police station. Since it was fruitless to search for the child's parents. The authorities handed over the baby boy to Happy Times Child Care Initiatives for guardianship.

He was found in a trench

On October 10, last year, a baby boy was found abandoned by an unknown person in a trench in Bombo-Kalule zone in Luwero district.

A Good Samaritan rescued the child in the trench river and reported the incident to Luwero police station for further management.

Through the probation officer, Luwero district the baby boy was referred to Happy Times Child Care Initiatives for care and protection. The child was named Musa Rayan Mukisa.

He was about one-day-old, when a resident, Steven Mutibwa discovered him in the bush on July 12, last year in Kikaabya village, Katikamu subcounty in Luwero district.

The child welfare office of Wobulenzi police station was informed and the incident was handled.

Later on, the baby boy was transferred to Happy Times Child Care Initiatives for protection.

The home care named him Nolan Anunda. Anunda is aged 7 months. To connect him to the relatives, call 0772837191 or 0753591883.



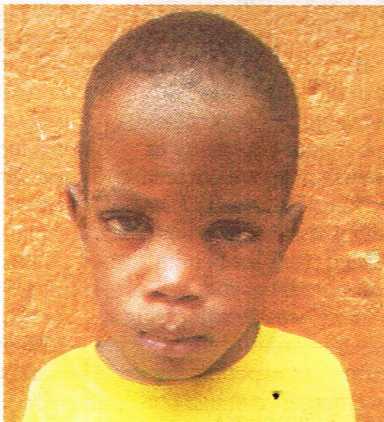
Blessing Sunshine Suubi was left on the verandah

Mahoro was diagnosed with a hole in the heart
