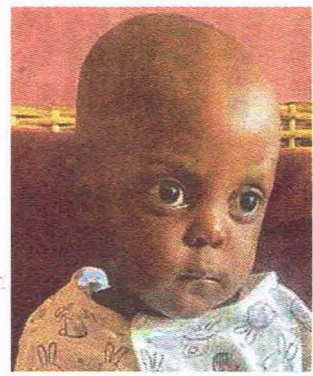

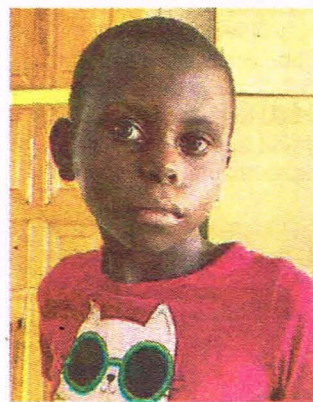


Peter abandoned at night in Mbalwa

On December 27, 2024, a security guard on duty heard cries near a workshop in Mbalwa, Wakiso district. He found a baby boy, about one-year-old, alone in the night. Police recorded the case and handed the child, now called Peter, to Rafiki Africa Ministries the same day.

Abwoki stranded in Kirinya



On July 16, 2025, a girl estimated to be 10 years old was found sitting silently on a verandah in Kirinya, Wakiso district. She gave her name as Abwoki, but refused to explain how she ended up alone. Police efforts to locate her family failed, and she was referred to Rafiki Africa Ministries for care.

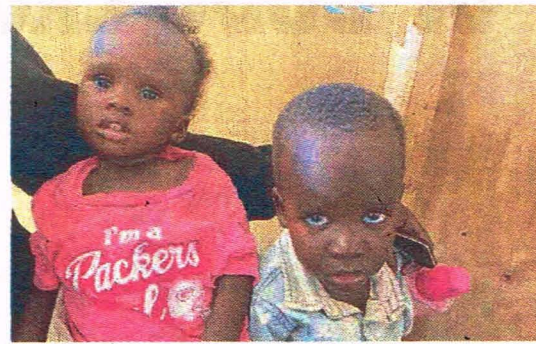
Siblings locked in house

In Kirinya-Bukasa Masooti village, neighbours discovered that a three-year-old and a two-year-old had been locked inside their home without food or water. By the time the door was broken open, both children were pale and weak.

With the help of local leaders,

they were rushed to a nearby clinic for medical care. Police later referred them to Rafiki Africa Ministries on December 18, 2024, for protection.

Miracle left at a Namugongo mosque

During prayers on May 5, 2024, two women noticed a toddler crying outside a mosque in Kyaliwajjala, Namugongo, Wakiso district. Assuming the mother was inside, they initially ignored the child. Hours later, the child was still alone.

Local leaders and police intervened and on May 13, 2024, the child, who was named Miracle, was taken to Rafiki Africa Ministries. Community members with leads about Miracle's family can call 0779107028 / 041599704.

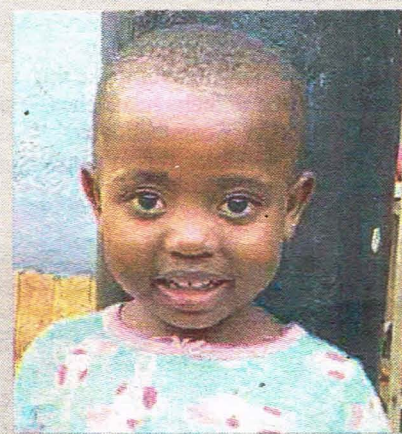


He was left near Kasokoso church

On September 8, 2025, two women passing Kasokoso Seventh Day Adventist Church heard a baby crying in the dark. They found a one-year-old boy alone and left him at Kasokoso Police Post.

Despite neighbourhood searches, no family was found. The Police handed the child, now named Luke, to Rafiki Africa Ministries.

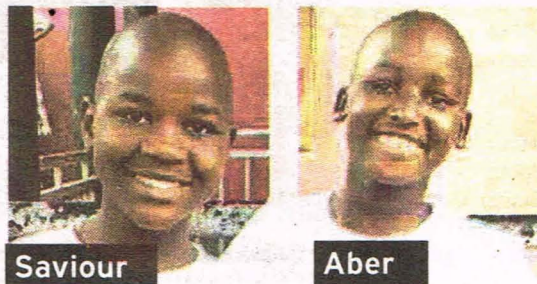
She was abandoned during Uganda Martyrs celebrations

On June 2, 2024, amidst the crowds heading to the Uganda martyrs site in Namugongo, Wakiso district, Florence Atim found a child abandoned at Kisaasi roundabout a few kilometres away. The Police asked her to temporarily care for the child while announcements were made during

the celebrations. No family came forward, and months later, Atim reported the matter to Kira Police. On January 12, 2025, the child, now called Maria, was referred to Rafiki Africa Ministries.

Saviour and Aber were victims of trafficking

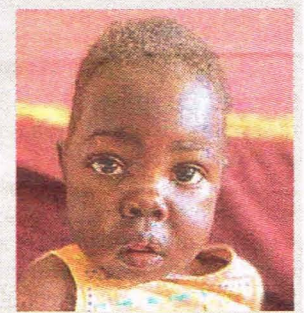

In September 2023, Kira Road Police arrested Florence Agalo, suspected of trafficking children from Karamoja sub-region in northeast Uganda. She was caught with two children, Saviour and Aber, without any proof of relation. A case of child trafficking was registered, and while Agalo was taken to court, the children were entrusted to Rafiki Africa Ministries on September 24, 2023.

During a downpour in Kirinya Kito B, cries from a swamp drew community members who discovered a baby abandoned there. The LC1 chairman contacted the Police, who recorded the case on July 24, 2025. On July 28, 2025, the child, who was named Precious, was placed under Rafiki Africa Ministries' care.

On May 31, 2025, a Bukasa resident heading to her garden heard muffled sounds and discovered a newborn wrapped in a black plastic bag. The Police recorded the case and later, on July 28, 2025, handed the baby, named Ezra, to Rafiki Africa Ministries.
