

Senkusu tips UWbF

The Kira Municipal Education officer Michael Senkusu has urged Uganda Woodball Federation to focus on the growth of the sport in both primary and secondary schools for a bright future.

Senkusu made the appeal at the closing ceremony of the inaugural Kira Municipal schools' Woodball tournament held at Tooto Ndiwulira school-Mbalwa in Kira Municipality on Saturday.

"We are excited to see that the first tournament has attracted such numbers. This is the way to go and Uganda Woodball Federation (UWbF) should focus on growing the sport in schools especially primary and secondary for the future," Senkusu said.

After putting up a dominant performance at the Dolphins Junior Championships last Saturday, Sailfish Swim Club has set its sights on even bigger prizes this season, with a renewed focus on the Uganda Aquatics National League and the National Championships due in July.

Club coach Joseph Kabogozza believes the recent victory has injected confi-

dence and hunger into the team as they prepare for tougher competitions ahead. "The win gave our swimmers a lot of motivation, and they are now hungry for more victories," Kabogozza said.

The club's long-term ambition this year extends beyond local success. Sailfish is targeting strong representation on the national team that will compete at the Africa Aquatics Zone III Championships due in Kampala in November.

Sailfish clinched the junior championship title in emphatic fashion, accumulating 465.5 points, thanks to stand-out performances from Emmanuel Mutebi, Abigael Muttamba, and Barack Etot.

Hosts Dolphins Swim Club finished second with 279.5 points.
